Some people selflessly step up in crisis without a thought to their own safety. Our manager, Norman Faust, is one of those heroes. On a rainy Saturday night in last May's flood, Norm left the restaurant after work on his way home. The freeway was closed due to high water and he pulled over on higher ground in a parking lot where he saw a group of people staring at a car almost completely submerged in the flood waters of I-10 and Beltway 8 feeder road.

Norm asked if anyone was in the vehicle and no one knew, but he thought he saw a person in the car. Norman went into rescue mode and tied a rope around his waist and waded into the chest high water. When he got to the car, he found a woman trapped inside still in her seatbelt with the water to her chin. He was able to open

the door and in 'Norm fashion' began assuring her and coaxing her to trust him. As he put her on his back he told her "now don't get fresh with me" to lighten the crisis for the frightened driver, and the two made their way to higher ground.
