

Texas History Summer Stops

Washington on the Brazos: Where Texas became Texas! Just west of Houston on the Brazos River is a place you won't want to miss! Famous attractions like The Star of the Republic Museum, Barrington Living History Farm (home of Anson Jones), and Independence Hall allow you to experience where it all started and where our founding fathers signed the Texas Declaration of Independence. The Republic of Texas' last President was Anson Jones, who presided over the ceremony when Texas became the 28th State in the USA. Around the corner is the Blue Bell Creamery - save room for dessert! It's always a family favorite.



The Bryan Museum: This one-of-akind Texas History museum showcases one of the world's largest collections of historical artifacts, documents, and artwork related to Texas. Nina loves the Bryan Museum!

San Jacinto Museum and Battlefield The San Jacinto Monument is Texas's landmark. Taller than the Washington

Monument, this towering structure reminds us of all who fought valiantly in the battle that won Texas' independence. Did you know San Jacinto is one of the most decisive battles in world history? These hallowed grounds remain a center point of our Texas Pride and what makes us unique.



The Ever-Impressive Alamo: The "Cradle of Texas Liberty" is significantly expanding and upgrading. The recently opened Ralston Family Center houses such treasures as the Phil Collins Collection, a life-size bronze of Col. William Travis famously drawing a "line in the sand," and an exact to-scale replica of the Alamo at the time of the battle on March 6, 1836.

Phil Collins Collection: You may know him as a British rock legend of the band Genesis, but did you also know Phil owns one of the largest

collections of Texas artifacts and documents? Why? Because Collins became enthralled with Davey Crockett when he was five years old, and as an adult, he realized how vital FREEDOM's message was from the story of Texas Independence. He generously donated his collection to the Alamo. Visitors can explore his aweinspiring artifacts and listen to his narration of the battle at the Alamo Exhibit in the Ralston Family Collections Center.

Travis' Last Letter: In March, we had the honor of attending the Alamo 1724 Gala - marking the 300th anniversary of when Spain built the Mission Valero (we know it as the Alamo!) Special Guests included Texas Lt. Governor Dan Patrick and Land Commissioner Dawn Buckingham as Commissioner Buckingham arranged the breathtaking temporary display of the original Travis' Last Letter! Reading that letter and seeing it in its original form stirs the soul of every Texan! And yes, Nina cried just to be in its presence! !

Artifacts Update



Texas Navy: Next to the salad bar is a corner dedicated to a powerful part of Texas history. The Texas Navy defended the Republic of Texas for seven years before being absorbed into the US Navy when Texas became a State. Located next to table 40 (easy to find - just ask any staff member,) we have the stunning hat of Commodore Edwin Moore. This unique collection includes his sword, sword belt, hat, and hatbox, which are magnificently displayed

and are not to be missed! From swords to hats and rifles, take a moment to visit this tribute to the brave men who served the Republic of Texas.
